

Testing for Lyme Disease What you need to know

Lyme disease affects more than 300,000 people each year.¹

There are more than 2.4 million patient specimens tested for Lyme annually²

The CDC recommends a two-tier testing algorithm for testing for Lyme Disease.³

Sofia 2 Lyme FIA is a tier one test that can be done in the doctor's office 88% of tier one tests are negative for Lyme² Conly positives require Western Blot confirmation Approximately 50% of positive or equivocal tier one Lyme tests are confirmed by Western Blot.²

Designed to be done together

Who should you test?

Only symptomatic patients with possible exposure to infected ticks.

Physicians may need to change the way they currently order Lyme testing.




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Sofia 2 Lyme FIA: CLIA-waived results in minutes, not days.
